

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

ALL INCOMING STUDENTS **MUST** COMPLETE THE FOLLOWING BY AUGUST 1, 2019:

1. Review the Consent for Treatment Form.
2. Review the Notice of Privacy Practices.
3. Complete Tuberculosis (TB) Screening and/or testing.
4. Provide documentation of two measles/mumps/rubella (MMR) immunization or proof of immunity (blood titer).

Step 1: Go to MyHealth portal

To access MyHealth portal, log into the my.LMU.edu. From the top menu, choose **System Logins** and select **MyHealth** portal

Step 2: Review and acknowledge the following forms

- **Consent for Treatment** and indicate agreement by checking the box. If you are under 18 years old, download **Consent for Treatment of a Minor** located in download forms. Print this form and have it signed by your parent or guardian and submit it to SHS.
- **Notice of Privacy Practices** and acknowledge by checking the box.

Step 3: TB testing

- If listed as required on MyHealth portal, complete the **TB Risk Screening Questionnaire**

Students born in a country with high incidence of TB (see list on the back) or students who answered "YES" to any of the questions outlined on the TB Risk Screening Questionnaire **Must**:

- Enter the date of TB skin or blood test done within the last 12 months on the **Immunization Entry form**.
- For positive blood or skin TB test you **MUST** submit a chest x-ray report.

Step 4: Complete Immunization Entry Form

- Input your immunization/testing dates.

Step 5: Upload Records

- Upload copies of your immunization/testing records and, if applicable, TB test records and chest x-ray report to **MyHealth** portal.

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HIGH RISK FACTORS FOR ACQUIRING TB ARE AS FOLLOW:

- Close contact with persons known or suspected to have active TB disease
- Persons born in one of the countries listed below that have a high incidence of active TB disease
- Frequent or prolonged visits to one or more of the countries listed below with a high prevalence of TB disease
- A resident and/or employee of high-risk congregate settings (e.g., correctional facilities, long-term care facilities, and homeless shelters)
- A volunteer or health-care worker who served clients who are at increased risk for active TB disease
- A member of any of the following groups that may have an increased incidence of latent M. tuberculosis infection or active TB disease — medically underserved, low-income, or abusing drugs or alcohol
